
Logging in

- Go to https://login.projectfoundry.net/. You should make a bookmark for this page to access it easily.
 - Schoolname = HCA
 - Username will be the same as their Google username. For most students this follows the convention: First Initial + Last
 Name (e.g., John Smith = jsmith)
 - Passwords are set and can be changed at any time by students. You should ask them to supply you with their password.
 Passwords can be changed by clicking the student's name at the top right corner of the screen, then "edit profile."

What is their current progress toward meeting content standards?

Click on the Tab labeled "Performance" to view your student's progress towards completing Passage Standards (i.e Passage from Division 1 to Division 2, from Division 2 to Division 3, and from Division 3 to graduation). It has 3 key features:

- Pie chart: Shows progress towards
 Passage, meaning it represents ALL of the standards needed to reach passage-standards students have demonstrated proficiency in AND standards they have not yet encountered.
 - Green represents standards met/exceeded..
 - Yellow represents standards in progress, meaning a student is currently enrolled in a course, investigation, or internship that covers these standards. These should be thought of as standards they are eligible to meet: when they turn in meeting




work, yellow areas will become green by the end of the term.

- Gray represents the work remaining until passage. These are either standards they have not yet encountered or standards they have not met.
- Pink represents standards that have been taught by teachers but not met by a student.


- Bar graph: Shows what portion of their completed work has met or not met standards.
- <u>Drop-down menus:</u> Allow you to see the specific learning targets they've worked on in each content area. Within each content area, there are more specific skill areas called "standards," and under each of these are "Learning Targets."



What are their current Habits of Work and Learning (HOWL) ratings?


Strong Habits of Work and Learning are critical to success at HCA and beyond. To see your student's HOWLs ratings, click on the "Performance" tab, then the "Heat-Map" sub-tab, and finally on the "Show Skills" bubble.

- HOWLs are displayed as a "Heat-Map" to quickly see how frequently your child scores in different areas. The darker the shade, the more marks have been received at that level. In the example below, the most frequent marks were "Meeting" in both Work Completion and Participation in the Learning Community.
- Boxes are clickable. A box will appear showing you what assignments earned the given mark.



How do I see a list of Missing work?

1) After logging in, click on the "Performance" tab. You will see the heading "Overall Learning Target and Credit Progress," followed by a green bar. **Click on the bar**.



- 2) You will be taken to a new page that looks like this. There will be a number of drop-down menus. To see missing work, do the following:
 - a) Subject: Select "All"
 - b) Show: Select "Attempted, Not Completed"
 - c) Select the dates you'd like to see missing work from.
- 3) Click "SEARCH" on the right side of the screen. You will see a list of assignments below that are <u>either</u> incomplete or did not meet the standard. At HCA, work can almost always be revised to meet the standard. Your child should use this list to help them make up missed work.
